### Results of University and other Examinations

### GENERAL REMARKS

Religion is not as well done as it should be in V and VI; the working of the Progress was not satisfactory especially in V. In III after allowing for the absence of the teacher for some weeks an inadequate programme was presented in several subjects including Arithmetic. The percentages in Geography, History and Arithmetic therefore are not in proportion to the amounts which should have been submitted for examination, e.g. 25 papers in History and 20 papers in Geography. Arithmetic did not go beyond the money rules. The teacher in III needs to exercise eye power more when he is examining the whole class and is standing close to the front desks. The weaknesses in V and VI are in the important subjects of Spelling and Arithmetic. Full working should be inserted with answers in Arithmetic.

The Religious Knowledge syllabus in Juniors was limited in extent, considering the time of the year, and not really well known. Church History had not been studied on methodical lines. French Pronunciation and Latin Pronunciation, below Juniors, will require more attention.
