GENERAL REMARKS

Owing to the early date of the examinations, naturally, only a limited portion of the programme was presented.

The answering all round was up to a satisfactory standard, except arithmetic in 5th grade. It would be advisable to give the boys in this grade more practice in doing miscellaneous examples from the text book. The boys & history in grades V & VI require more attention. The boys should be given practice in answering the questions at the end of each chapter in the text books. Remarkable progress has been made in building up this comparatively new school. With 39 boys in the Junior University class and satisfactory numbers in the other grades, the prospects for the future are encouraging.

The general tone of the school and conduct of the boys reflect much credit on the training which the boys receive.

As soon as it is possible, something should be done to relieve the superior from the full responsibility of all the subjects in the Junior University class, Science excepted.
