GENERAL REMARKS

The enrolment still hovers about the 200 mark. A wider course in Christian Doctrine is recommended. More attention should be given to the text of the Catechism. In the 1st and 2nd Years the full text of the new Catechism should be memorised and should be included in the syllabus for the Annual Examination.

Arithmetic is a weak subject in the school; Eng. lish, Geography and History are only fairly satisfactory. In refinement, good manners and general tone the pupils are well above the average. In ^{practical} Christian piety receives careful attention.
