GENERAL REMARKS

Notwithstanding the opening of Leederville and the consequent transference of the boys from that parish to their own school the Roll Call this year is 284 as against 260 at the time of last year's examination. This healthy condition is a reflex of the excellent work being done in the classrooms. The results in the Public Examinations have been most gratifying and are a tribute not only to those directly responsible but also to the teachers in the Primary section who are laying such a solid foundation. The worth of that work may be gleaned from the results given above.

While the amount of work covered in the C. D. syllabus in Grades IV, V + VI was insufficient the answering of the boys in what had been prepared and in the Prayers left no room for complaint. In the Secondary Classes the answers submitted were well above the average in merit. The system of writing begun in Grade III may be traced throughout the whole school. Arithmetic showed weakness especially, the Mental Science had not been taught in Grades V + VI nor had Nature Study in Grades III + IV. The boys by their behaviour as well as by their knowledge showed that Christian Politeness is receiving due attention. I was particularly impressed by the type of boy found in the Senior Classes
