GENERAL REMARKS

Except for the heavy load carried by the teachers of 4th & 5th the classes are well organised and taught. There is a good spirit amongst the boys and their personal demeanour is very pleasing. The meanings of the more difficult words in the Collection require more attention though the text was usually well known. Arithmetic and Spelling, as is the case almost everywhere, proved the two subjects most difficult for which to score a good percentage.

Christian Politeness has been attended to in the upper classes particularly. The work of the secondary classes in Religion was very satisfactory.
