GENERAL REMARKS

The School is in a prosperous condition. Enrolment 340, the highest yet attained. Organisation and management are good and the pupils well cared for. University results testify to careful and enlightened teaching in upper classes. The school seems to be regional rather than parochial. 79 boys only belong to the Highgate Parish, 61 to Maylands, 16 to Bayswater, 20 to Monastery, 16 to Bedford Park, 13 to East Perth, smaller numbers from Bayswater (6), Guildford (5), Midland (5), Subiaco (5), Inglewood (7) Brenton Park (4), Armadale (6).

Discipline is good and an excellent spirit exists amongst the boys. Religion is well taught in all classes although there was some weakness in Catechism text and in the prayers. Some boys seemed to be unfamiliar with the devotional practices usually emphasised in our schools - the 3 Hail Marys, Sacred Heart. Frequent exhortation by a zealous teacher can do much to establish the practice of these devotions. The Rosary and frequent Communion call for special emphasis.

Home exercises were neatly done on the whole but many mistakes were left uncorrected. More attention to formation of letters is desirable in the lower division of the school.
