GENERAL REMARKS

SECONDARY SUBJECTS TAUGHT

As the numbers above indicate, there has been disregard for the regulation on the size of classes, and the consequence is an unfair burden on at least half the present staff. The present Superior cannot remedy the situation as it stands. But he will not prolong it. The drop in V may be a sign of future trends, as the locality is changing rapidly in character. Population is moving further out.

All in all, good work is being done in spite of the excessive numbers. The two lay teachers are extremely keen, and competent also. Mrs Brown follows the old methods. The smiles are well taught. She stresses oral English. I have met no class where the boys are so ready and capable. Mr Jeffrey is an enthusiast for written English, a distinct acquisition to the school. He could be used kept up.

I commend the work of the young brother in his first year. He manages his huge class with ease. He has his work well prepared. He is clear and decisive. In every class the boys displayed a pleasant, respectful manner and maintained a keenness & give of their best. The large Italian element in the school, especially in V, were delightful youngsters.

C.D. needs greater use of b. board too much mere text book rattling. C. History is a distinct lack. C. 2. Segars recognises the situation it needs, but boys are well mannered. Classification has been satisfactory it must be insisted on from the very beginning.
