GENERAL REMARKS

Grade V: Too much emphasis is placed on mere memorization; a lot of the work is above the understanding of the boys and is learned by repetition in a narrow field.

Grade VI: The teacher is enthusiastic but rowdy: this is reflected in the restlessness + talkativeness of the class; in spite of this, satisfactory work is being done.

Grade VII: Good standard reached. The best approach to teaching is witnessed here.

In all classes the spread of intelligence is wide. Reading, Written English need special care as nearly half of the boys in the primary classes speak a second language
