GENERAL REMARKS

The decrease in numbers while it is to be noted as indication of a trend and of future needs especially in building, cannot be considered as unfortunate. On the contrary class numbers are brought within limits facilitating the teaching and making for equality of opportunity. There are few if any seriously retarded boys while the more capable can be stimulated to higher effort. Grade 5 could have been down by ten on present figures. A late group enrolment from Mallemara saved the situation. Mrs Brown lays a good foundation with hard, old fashioned teaching of basic subjects. The young man alongside, Mr Viles, has great vigour and potential but may lack consistency. Grade 7 is good. Nothing is omitted. The Nature Study deserves mention. In all classes a more lively interest in singing and poetry would be beneficial. All classes ought to use the radio and T.V. more freely. The secondary classes appear well disciplined and reasonably studious. Science provision is inadequate. Classes below the Senior get very little practical experience. The large body of Stahar boys deserves praise for their fine behaviour, attitude & teachers and interest in all aspects of education.
