GENERAL REMARKS

The boys impressed by their neat and tidy appearance, by their well-mannered behaviour and by their friendliness. The school and yard were kept well. The new Science wing, including Staff Room and Tuck Shop, were a great asset. It will be a big help to the Senior Classes and has made available a large room for Technical Drawing and other divided classes. The new equipment for T.D. makes it one of the best equipped rooms in the State.

About Bradford Park, the teachers salaries seem far too low and will have to be brought into line with the State Department schedule. The problem of extra accommodation will be a serious one as the boys from the Junior Class at Bradford are expected to be taken at Highgate. It is expected that about 20 such boys will be applying for admission next year. It could be that this will mean two sub-Leaving Classes in 1968.
