This decrease in class numbers gives better conditions for closer and more efficient teaching so that some provision can be made for the big number of migrant boys who attend this school. There is an atmosphere of satisfaction and order conducive to healthy study habits and a favourable impression is gained from the friendly and manly conduct of the boys.
